

The sole basis of our beliefs is the Bible, God's infallible written Word. We believe that it is fully inspired by God and from God, and that it was written without error. It is the ultimate authority on all matters on which it speaks.

- There is only one true and living God. He is all-knowing and all-powerful. He created the world and everything in it. To know Him gives us peace, joy, and fulfillment, and is the source of strength in our lives. We were created to have fellowship with Him and to worship Him (Deut 6:4, Isa 44:6, Mat 28:18, Col 2:9).
- Man was created to live in perfect relationship with God, however, through our disobedience, sin entered our lives, separating us from God (Gen 3:8, Isa 59:2).
- God chose to walk among us in the flesh in order to bridge the gap caused by sin. He lived a perfect life only to bare the weight of the world on the cross, reaping the punishment that we all deserved. Because He was without sin, death had no hold on Him, and on the third day, He resurrected (Jn 6:40, 2 Cor 6:14).
- Though Jesus's sacrifice and resurrection, we are given the gift of salvation through repentance, the receiving of the Holy Ghost, and baptism in the **NAME** of the father, son, and holy ghost (Jn 11:25, Rom 6:8-11, Rom 4:25, Act 2:38, Act 3:19, 1 Pet 3:21, Jn 3:5, Eph 4:5, Act 2:4, Act 19:6).
- After Christ resurrected, He instructed the apostles instruction to go and make disciples, teaching them the Gospel, and baptizing them in Jesus name. After our spiritual resurrection, we are called to be a part of the Great Commission, communicating Jesus to every nation (Mat 28:18-20, Mar 16:15, Jn 21:20).
- The Holy Ghost is the spirit of God living inside of us. It gives us the ability and confidence to be witnesses, first to ourselves, that we can overcome the power of sin in our lives. Then, it gives us the power and strength to witness and demonstrate to others that they, too, can live victoriously over sin and become all that God intended for them to be (Rom 8:26, 1 Cor 6:19).
- Together we manifest the Body of Christ. The ultimate proof of our knowledge of God and His spirit in our lives is in the way we live each day. Ours is a living and dynamic faith. We demonstrate our relationship with God in the relationships we have with those around us. It is through our love, sacrifice, and commitment to others that we genuinely and authentically show what it means to know God in a personal way. We believe that life is a gift from God; how we live it is our gift to God (Jn 14:15, Jn 14:31, Jam 1:22-25, Jam 2:17).
